Resilient Youth Safer Environments

- Five-year youth suicide prevention grant 2019-2024.
- Creates comprehensive Suicide Safer Early Intervention and Prevention Systems aimed at supporting youth-serving organizations.
- Grant supports youth 10-24 years old in Galveston County.

Project RYSE (2 of 2)

Resilient Youth Safer Environments

- Annual award of \$736,000 to HHSC from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).
- State partnerships include Gulf Coast Center, Region 4 Education Service Center (ESC), Texas Suicide Prevention Collaborative, and the Texas Institute of Excellence in Mental Health at UT (UT-TIEMH).
