

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What is the problem?

The 12 months between the end of active military service and reintegration back into civilian life - the **'deadly gap'** - is the most stressful and dangerous time for a new Veteran. During this 12 month period, Veterans commit suicide at rates 2.3x above the national average.

Only Transition Organization with:

- All VA certified and trained Mentors
- Immediate ability to connect High Risk TSM with VA healthcare within 24 hours
- Upstream enrollment offering seamless continuity for veterans

Over 15000 new Veterans served and growing

The Onward Ops Model

- Enrollment before leaving service MOAs with VA and DoD allow us to enroll Servicemembers 6-12 months before the end of active military service
- Mentor located in Veteran's destination city given the option of a Mentor and provided a comprehensive set of tools to manage their transition and connect to proven, vetted resources
- States are provided awareness of incoming veterans Destination communities informed of incoming Veterans months in advance, allowing for proactive outreach and positive condition setting through Onward Ops Career Engine
- <u>Google Workspace Dashboard</u> Every enrollee receives a free dashboard secured to IL-4 standard, enabling a seamless digital transition



VSN provides programming to support military and veteran families as they navigate active-duty life, transition to civilian life, and put down roots after military life.

0-3 MONTH ATTITUDE

- Increase community awareness of veteran suicide
- Increase sponsor awareness of local resources
- Increase education opportunities regarding VA services and qualifications
- Increase sponsor awareness of suicide risk factors
- Increase identification of suicide risk
- Satisfaction surveys completed twice monthly

6+ MONTH CONDITION

- Decrease rates of veteran suicides within 6 months of discharge from military
- Decrease user suicidal risk by addressing SDOH needs upstream
- Increase sustainable stability for TSM
- Increase sense of community
- Previous TSM register to become certified sponsors
